

WELCOME TO COBLESKILL GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

Nestled in the Schoharie Valley, Cobleskill Golf & Country Club opened in 1929 and was expanded to 18 holes in 1994. An interesting and challenging layout. We offer multiple sets of tees to suit golfers of all ability levels. We are known for our well-manicured greens and as one of the most scenic golf courses in the Northeast.

HOLE 1 “POSTAGE STAMP” The opening hole is a short Par 5. The fairway is uphill to start and slopes to the right. The small green slopes severely from back to front.

HOLE 2 “OLD HICKORY” A short downhill Par 3 with a small pond front left and bunker on the right. The green slopes from back to front.

HOLE 3 “FRONT 9 POND” The ultimate risk/reward hole. A conservative play left of the pond will leave a 120-150 uphill approach or carry the pond and get it close to the green.

HOLE 4 “INTERSTATE 88” A straight Par 4. A portion of the Front Nine Pond lurks to the right front of the green.

HOLE 5 “FUNNEL” A well-placed tee shot in the right center of the fairway will give the best opportunity to negotiate the narrow approach to the green at the top of the hill.

HOLE 6 “TOP OF THE WORLD” The tee box on this Par 5 provides a panoramic view of the scenic Village of Cobleskill below. A large tree and Out of Bounds left must be avoided off the tee.

HOLE 7 “THE PINES” Like Hole 1, this fairway tilts to the right. The green also slopes severely from back to front. Downhill and side hill putts can run off the front of the green.

HOLE 8 “SHORT AND SWEET” Our shortest Par 3. The hole is slightly uphill, so the flag stick is visible from the tee, but the surface of the green is not.

HOLE 9 “CLUBHOUSE” A straight away Par 5 from an elevated tee. The Greenside Clubhouse sits just to the right of the green ready to serve those in need of food or beverage at the turn.

HOLE 10 “WINDY” A long downhill Par 3 can be played successfully in different ways. Either a high tee shot to the green or a lower shot can roll on.

HOLE 11 “CROSS COUNTRY” A challenging Par 5. The house on the hill in the background is a good target off the tee. Beware Out of Bounds left. The green is guarded in the front by a stream.

HOLE 12 “BIG TROUBLE” A long uphill dogleg right plays into the prevailing West wind. Out of Bounds left of the fairway is also very near the green.

HOLE 13 “ISLAND GREEN” A solid well-placed tee shot is required to set up the approach to this short Par 4. A well struck approach is required to stick this green which is guarded on all sides by water penalty areas.

HOLE 14 “TURTLE BACK” This Par 3 plays uphill all the way. Those who hit the green and walk away with a Par are ahead of the game.

HOLE 15 “TURN FOR HOME” This is a short dogleg Par 4. A pond borders the right of the fairway and trees and bunkers guard the green.

HOLE 16 “BACK 9 POND” This Par 4 demands both distance and accuracy off the tee. Avoid the water right and the Out of Bounds left.

HOLE 17 “BORST NOBLE ROAD” The final Par 3 is all carry to a tricky two-tiered green.

HOLE 18 “HOME HOLE” The final hole is a dogleg right and uphill all the way. This is another green which is sloped severely from back to front.
